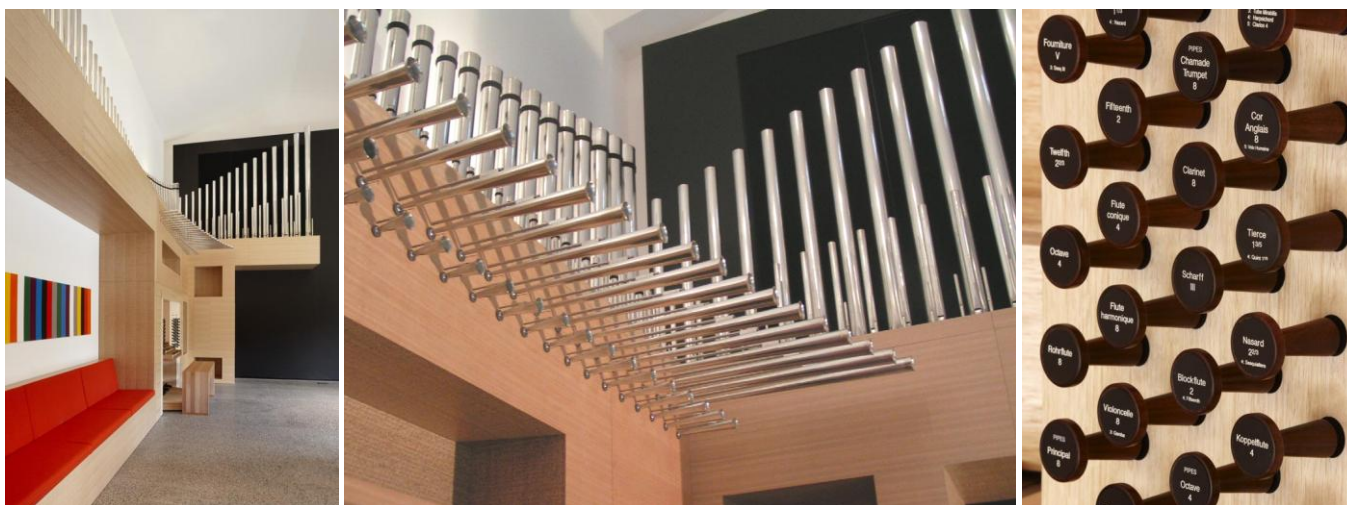
Rod Junor, Masterpieces and Miniatures. Acclaimed concert performer Rod Junor will play a special program on the Housemuseum Concert Organ to showcase the organ's range of colours and tonalities. This is a performance not to be missed. Program includes works by Bach, Handel, Bennett, Couperin and Vierne.

Roderick Junor studied organ playing and repertoire and organ design in Australia, Holland, France and Germany and has given many concerts during this period. Junor was a regular performer at the Melbourne International Organ Festival in the 1970s and 80s, playing by invitation at all major Melbourne venues. He has appeared with the Melbourne and other Victorian Symphony orchestras and has been a prize winner and finalist in many Australian competitions. Junor's organ tonal and technical design consulting work has included the largest church organ in Australia at St Patrick's Basilica Fremantle and for nine years he was curator and consultant on the Melbourne Town Hall organ. The concert will include: Suite and Sonata movements from Baroque France, Germany, Italy and Spain, including highlighting the pipes of the organ (Gedeckt, Diapasons and Trumpet), Thalben-Ball, Bach 'Fugue' from *Tocatta in C*, and Vierne, 'Finale' from *Symphony no. 1*.

TANGERINE DREAM – MELBOURNE MUSIC WEEK

Founded in 1967, German electronic music pioneers Tangerine Dream have been at the forefront of music creation for more than four decades. Edgar Froese and his collaborators have been central in the development of krautrock, psychedelia, electronic dance music and new age music. Well-known for their Hollywood film soundtracks including *Sorcerer* and *Risky Business*, they recently composed the score for *Grand Theft Auto V* video game. Tangerine Dream will feature the ten thousand pipes of the Melbourne Town Hall Grand Organ in a match made in heaven – or at least some mystical dominion. Fans old and new won't be disappointed as many of the synth-laden tracks are re-imagined for the acoustic phenomenon behind the impressive façade. Supported by Black Cab, Melbourne's own kraut inspired, electronic lead-out men, first formed in 2004. With James Lee delivering a mighty sonic punch on the Grand Organ, this promises to be a defining moment, ahead of the release of the band's long awaited fourth album.
